The Child Development Fund (CDF)

founded in 2008, has been devoting itself to facilitating a tripartite, cross-sector collaboration among the community, the business sector and the Government to gear up children from a disadvantaged background, enabling them to pursue their dreams.

The CDF projects are implemented by non-governmental organisations or schools over a course of three years. Each of them comprises three key elements, namely Mentorship, Personal Development Plan and Targeted Savings. Through training and value-added activities, children are encouraged to boost their capabilities and confidence; nurture saving habits and expand their social network.

Mentorship

Each partaking child will be matched with an adult mentor who volunteers to offer advice in their pursuit of aspirations, and help broaden their horizon, boost self-esteem, and establish positive outlook along their growing path.

Responsibilities

To keep in contact with mentee at least once a month, sharing life experiences, offering suggestions, support and encouragement;

To assist mentee to come up with a Personal Development Plan within the first two years of the programme, and guide the mentee to realise the plan with the Targeted Savings by the end of the third year;

To attend mentorship training and experience sharing sessions organised by the non-governmental organisation (NGO) and school project operators; and

To provide feedback to the NGO or school operators in various stages of the programme.


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Mentorship To Forge Lasting Bonds
